Your city's base fee, rate per kWh, and reconnection fee are all high compared to other cities. Other cities provide bill discounts to seniors and payment arrangements.

**Base fee:** what your utility charges each month before you even turn the lights on

**Rate per kWh :** how much your utility charges for each unit of electricity used. On average, households in Georgia use 1,121 kWh per month.



Your electricity utility serves **2,189 customers** and is controlled by your **mayor and City Council**. Talk to them about making changes to your utility.



An energy burden is the percentage of your income spent on your electricity. In your county, **45.3% of households have a high energy burden** (they spend 6% or more of their income on electricity).



An energy audit measures how much energy your house is wasting because of inefficiency. **Your city utility does NOT provide energy audits (other cities do).**



Your bill is **late on the 16th of each month and disconnections begin on the 22nd**. People with serious illnesses legally can't be disconnected if it will worsen their illness. See **Georgia Rule 515-3-2-.03** for details.
