Your city charges a \$5 late fee on bills \$100 and less OR a 5% fee on bills over \$100. We were unable to tell if your city provides a payment arrangement option, which other cities offer.

**Base fee:** what your utility charges each month before you even turn the lights on

**Rate per kWh :** how much your utility charges for each unit of electricity used. On average, households in Georgia use 1,121 kWh per month.



Your electricity utility serves **8,452 customers** and is controlled by your **Utility Commissioner** who is appointed. Talk to them about making changes to your utility.



An energy burden is the percentage of your income spent on your electricity. In your county, **25.3% of households have a high energy burden** (they spend 6% or more of their income on electricity).



An energy audit measures how much energy your house is wasting because of inefficiency. **Your city utility does NOT provide energy audits (other cities do).**



Electricity bills are considered **late 3-4 days** after they are due. People with serious illnesses legally can't be disconnected if it will worsen their illness. They must notify their utility. See **Georgia Rule 515-3-2-.03** for details.
